In Leviticus 23, each of the Feasts is laid out, describing how and when it is to be kept. Because there is no Temple, we cannot keep all of the Feasts, but their value and meaning are still alive and vivid, and they can be celebrated and remembered! When we celebrate the Passover, we don't bring a lamb to the Temple to be sacrificed, but we do relive the Israelites' rescue from slavery and recount the Messiah's ultimate sacrifice for us. When we celebrate Sukkot, we remember the Israelites in the desert, we are thankful for the birth of our Messiah, and we look forward to the Marriage Supper of the Lamb.

we don't grow up celebrating the Feasts of the LORD, they can seem different and unusual at first.

However, the Feasts are the Almighty's way of teaching us the most meaningful and extraordinary

truths of Scripture, our lives, and our relationship with our Creator.

Gathering together and celebrating the Feasts connects us to our history, our future, and to each other. Most importantly, it is a time to connect to YeHoVaH. He calls the Feasts appointments – they are the times in the year that he asks us to specifically set aside for him. The Feasts are a thread weaved through the Scriptures that allows us to recognize the details of the Almighty's great plan. Through their context, they make clear the words and actions of the Messiah.

There are many ways to celebrate the Feasts and no single, "right" way. Each one is its own special, set-apart time with its own significance in biblical history and prophecy. My own celebrations and observances of the Feasts change from year to year, but they all include taking the time to recognize the richness of the Almighty's design and being thankful for my place in it.

As summer will soon give way to fall, I encourage you to dive deep into the Feasts this year. Spend time learning the intricacies of each Feast and what it means. I guarantee that no matter how long you have been studying Scripture, you will learn something new because the Feasts aren't just old practices, they are alive with the Spirit of YeHoVaH and filled with that which was, and is, and is yet to come. In short, we GET to keep the Feasts.

How to Celebrate The Fall Feasts of The LORD

The Fall Feasts of the LORD, which all take place in the 7th month of the Hebrew calendar (aka Tishri), begin with Yom Teruah (The Day of Trumpets), a prophecy of Yeshua's second coming. Yorn Kippur (The Day of Atonement) and the Feast of Sukkot are prophetic shadow pictures of "Judgment Day" and other end time events fulfilled as per The Book of The Revelation, the "fifth Gospel."

FALL FEAST #1 Yom Teruah - Tishri 1

Yom Teruah is the first fall feast - it marks the start of the fall feast season. This year, Yom Teruah will begin at sunset, Tuesday, September 27, 2022 if the renewed moon is seen by at least two witnesses on that day.* Teruah means to make a loud noise, which is why Yom Teruah is also called the "Day of Trumpets" or even "Day of Shouting." Yorn Teruah recalls the day the Almighty shouted down the 10 commandments to the people from atop Mount Sinai.

Yorn Teruah is a unique feast as it is the only one that falls on the first day of a biblical month. This means we have to wait for the first sliver of the moon to be sighted to begin the day, so we don't know exactly when the feast will start. This is what Yeshua was referring to when he said that "no man will know the day or the hour" of his return, indeed, his return is the fulfillment of You Teruah.

FALL FEAST #2 Yom Kippur - Tishri 10

Not a feast per se but a fast, on Yom Kippur, we are told to do no work whatsoever and to "afflict our souls" or "deny ourselves." This year, if Yom Teruah begins as assumed on September 27, Yom Kippur will begin at sunset, Thursday, October 6, 2022. This is most often taken to mean fasting, or not eating. Most people who observe Yom Kippur do not eat or drink from sunset to sunset. The point of fasting is to help us focus on things that are more important than our body's desire for food. Our relationship with our Creator is the most important in our

In the last days, Yom Kippur marks the end of YeHoVaH's wrath upon the carth - the righteous are spared from this wrath as they will have been gathered to Messiah. Once the Almighty's wrath is ended, it will be time for the wedding feast of Messiah and his people (the Feast of Sukket).

FALL FEAST #3 Sukkot - Tishri 15-21

The Feast of Sukkot is a week-long festival also known as the Feast of Tabernacles, Feast of the Ingathering. Feast of Booths, or simply Sukkot. During this feast we are to live in a temporary dwelling (a "sukkah" the singular form of "sukkot") as a remembrance of dwelling in tents when the children of Israel were wandering in the desert.

There is only one High Sabbath in the Feast of Sukkot, the first day of Sukkot. This year, if Yom Teruah begins as assumed on September 27, the High Sabbath marking the commencement of Sukkot will begin at sunset, Tuesday, October 11, 2022. The day after the seventh day of Sukkot (Shemini Atzeret) is also a High Sabbath. It is technically the day after Sukkot ends, but is often mistaken as part of the Sukkot festival.

The first day of the Feast of Tabernacles was the day that Yeshua was born. This is an intermediate fulfillment of the Feast. The final fulfillment will occur at the future ingathering of the harvest, when Yeshua returns to reign on Earth.

Shemini Atzeret - Tishri 22

Shemini Atzeret (Tishri 22) is commonly considered the eighth day of Sukkot but it is actually a separate, High Sabbath of its own. It marks "The Last Great Day" on which Yeshua will return to rule the Earth with the Torah and a rod of iron. This year, if Yom Teruah begins as assumed on September 27, the High Sabbath of Shemini Atzeret will begin at sunset, Tuesday, October 18, 2022.
